STATE EMPLOYEE SUGGESTION INCENTIVE PROGRAM - STATISTICS

The 1993 Legislative Assembly established the state employee suggestion incentive program. The program (North Dakota Century Code Section 54-06-24) provides a one-time incentive payment to a state employee who submits a recommendation or proposal to reduce expenditures that is approved by the Suggestion Incentive Committee and implemented by the state agency. House Bill No. 1174 (1999) increased the incentive payment from 10 to 20 percent and the maximum payment from \$1,000 to \$2,000. The incentive payments reflected on the schedule below were paid prior to the change and calculated using the formula of 10 percent of savings up to \$1,000. Effective August 1, 2000, an employee is entitled to receive a one-time payment of 20 percent of any annual savings realized up to a maximum of \$2,000 for the first 12 months of implementation.
