FULL NOTICE OF INTENT TO AMEND ADMINISTRATIVE RULES RELATING TO RADIOLOGICAL HEALTH

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality ("Department") will hold a public hearing to address proposed amendments to North Dakota Administrative Code Article 33.1-10 at the following time and location:

The purpose of the proposed rule amendments is to comply with federal law. As a requirement of North Dakota's Agreement State status, the State of North Dakota is required to adopt rules that are compatible with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) rules. As a result of recent changes to the NRC rules, there are some changes/updates required to certain chapters of North Dakota Administrative Code Article 33.1-10.
