FULL NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT AND AMEND ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Industrial Commission, Department of Mineral Resources (DMR), Geological Survey, will hold a public hearing to address proposed amendments to the North Dakota Administrative Code (NDAC) Chapter 43-02-02 and to create Chapters 43-02-02.3 and 43-02-02.4 at 9am on January 22th, 2013 in the Conference Room of Department of Mineral Resources Building, 1000 E. Calgary Avenue, Bismarck, North Dakota. The proposals are summarized below:

The purpose of the proposed amendments to Chapter 43-02-02 is update, clarify, and make the subsurface mineral exploration and development rules more consistent with the approved general rules and regulations of the DMR, Oil & Gas Division which are similar in scope and intent. Included are amendments to thirty-four existing sections, the repeal of eight existing sections, and the addition of thirty-two new sections. Amendments to the rules include, but are not limited to, the following general topic areas: miscellaneous rules; drilling (including permits and bonds); plugging of wells; well production operating practices; reports; and special rules of order on procedure governing the conservation of subsurface minerals. The proposed amendments are not expected to have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000.

The purpose of the proposed adoption of Chapter 43-02-02.3 is to create a new chapter that regulates non-coal surface mining. The chapter consists of twenty-six sections of rules including, but not limited to, the following topics: miscellaneous rules; bonds; permits and applications; fees; operating practices; performance and reclamation standards and requirements; and reports. The proposed rules are not expected to have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000.

The purpose of the proposed adoption of Chapter 43-02-02.4 is to create a new chapter that regulates solution mining. The chapter consists of fifty sections of rules including, but not limited to, the following topics: miscellaneous rules; bonds; permits and applications; fees; surface facilities; mechanical integrity testing; operating practices; secondary containment; performance and reclamation standards and requirements; and reports. The proposed rules are not expected to have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000.

Boulevard, Bismarck, ND 58505, and received by 5pm, February 1st, 2013, will be fully considered. Oral comments can be given at the public hearing at 9am on January 22nd, 2013.
