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NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT ADMINISTRATIVE RULE CHANGES

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Department of Health (Department) will hold a public hearing to address proposed changes to North Dakota Administrative Code Article 33-04 ("Health Statistics") on April 8, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. (central time) in the Sakakawea Room, State Capitol, 600 East Boulevard Avenue, Bismarck, North Dakota.

The purpose of the proposed administrative rule changes is to update rules to incorporate state law changes included in House Bill 1004 of the 66th Legislative Assembly regarding the fees associated with certified copies of vital records. In addition, rules are being updated to reflect current business processes with regards to the electronic registration and certification of vital records and the need for required documentation for unattended home births. The proposed changes include requirements to be complied with by the Department. The proposed rules are not expected to impact the regulated community in excess of \$50,000.
