



#### Other Sections in Bill

Section 5 of the bill provides the statutory changes increasing the Secretary of State's salary. The Secretary of State's annual salary is increased from the current level of \$68,018 to \$70,739 effective July 1, 2005, and up to \$73,568 effective July 1, 2006.
