

Agency Funding

First House Action

Attached is a summary of the first house changes.

Executive Budget Highlights (With First House Changes Noted)

\$7,451,902 of federal funds. (The House removed the county matching funds and added \$76,100 from the general fund to be used for a portion of the required matching funds. The Secretary of State is to collect \$76,100 from the counties during the 2005-07 biennium to reimburse the general fund.)

Other Sections in Bill

Section 5 of the bill provides the statutory changes increasing the Secretary of State's salary. The Secretary of State's annual salary is increased from the current level of \$68,018 to \$70,739 effective July 1, 2005, and up to \$73,568 effective July 1, 2006. The House adjusted the Secretary of State's annual salary to \$70,059 effective July 1, 2005, and to \$72,861 effective July 1, 2006, to reflect the 3 percent and 4 percent salary increase.

Major Related Legislation

House Bill No. 1222 provides that the Secretary of State make information received from the Legislative Council on the estimated fiscal impact of an initiated measure available to the public.

House Bill No. 1507 requires the Secretary of State to register home inspectors.
