NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT ADMINISTRATIVE RULE

(revised)

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Department of Health will hold public hearings to address the proposed adoption of a rule to the Standards of Quality for Waters of the State, N.D. Admin. Code ch. 33-16-02.1, at 1:30 pm on October 5, 2009, at the Environmental training Center, 2639 East Main Ave., Bismarck, ND; at 1:30 pm on October 6, 2009, at Froemke Auditorium, Foss Music Hall, Valley City State University, Valley City, ND and at 2:00 pm on October 7, 2009 at Robert Fawcett Auditorium, Lake Region State College, Devils Lake, ND.

The purpose of the proposed rule is to change the maximum limit of sulfate in a segment of the Sheyenne River. The rule will change the maximum level of sulfate in the segment of the Sheyenne River that runs from its headwaters to 0.1 mile downstream from the Baldhill Dam, including Lake Ashtabula, from 450 mg/L to 750 mg/L. The proposed rule is not expected to have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000, so a regulatory analysis was not required.
