NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT, AMEND, AND REPEAL ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Department of Health will hold a public hearing to address proposed new and amendments to, and repealing and replacing of, N.D. Administrative Code Licensing of Emergency Medical Service chapter 23-27, N.D. Administrative Code Licensing of Emergency Medical Services Personnel Training, Testing, Certification, and Licensure chapter 33-36, and North Dakota Administrative Code Trauma and the Emergency Medical System chapter 23-01.2 at 8 am on Thursday, January 21, 2010 at State Capitol, Judicial Wing Room 212, 600 E. Boulevard Ave., Bismarck, ND.

The purpose of the proposed amendments and rules is to update current rules to be consistent with North Dakota Century Code, establish communications and performance standards for quick response units and ambulance services, and require pediatric specific equipment on ambulances.

The proposed amendments and rules may have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000. No taking of real property is involved in these rulemaking actions.
