

Generally if consumer's meter socket/terminal box is attached to building or property (assuming this is the first point of attachment outside of the provider's equipment) it would make clear who is responsible for making this termination or attaching equipment to building.
 - A. Remove liability for provider of electricity in the event of a burned terminal, damaged feeder, etc. (Majority of new installations are underground)
 - B. Give the consumer a definite person to call if a question rises(eliminating several calls)

Another issue this would solve is that the consumer would have an interest in where the meter socket could be located on their property (This issue came about last year when a certain power provider came up with a new rule that all meter sockets had to be on the side of the building/home and they would only furnish 60 feet of lateral /drop feed. I believe the reason for this was feeder maintenance and meter maintenance-decks, porches, concrete patios, etc were built over/around feeds and meters. This would make it the building owner's responsibility to ensure the equipment would be accessible, therefore the building owner would be held accountable for changes that they create themselves. One may find that electrical contractors would then set up metering/service disconnect equipment near utility easements on the edge of property. This would ensure that the feeder into the building/across the owners property is fused (has short circuit protection) on the secondary side offering some protection to personnel that may accidently dig into feeder when doing projects in their yard. Another advantage to this set-up would be during a residing/remodel of the building it would not be necessary to contend with bulky electrical boxes on the building creating problems and unforeseen charges. Also in the event of a building fire, the fire department would have somewhere to kill power without the power provider's assistance eliminating waiting-this could save more lives and property. Another note some power providers are making customer buy their own meters also, but it is specified by provider.

In dwellings or dwelling units with split levels and without an intervening door between the adjacent levels, a smoke alarm installed on the upper level shall suffice for the adjacent level provided that the lower level is less than one full story below the upper level.

When more than one smoke alarm is required to be installed within an individual dwelling unit the alarm devices shall be interconnected in such a manner that the actuation of one alarm will activate all of the alarms in the individual unit.

c. Household fire alarm systems installed in accordance with NFPA 72 that include smoke alarms, or a combination of smoke detectors and audible notification device installed as required by this section for smoke alarms, shall be permitted. The household fire alarm system shall provide the same level of smoke detection and alarm as required by this section for smoke alarms. Where a household fire warning system is installed using a combination of smoke detector and audible notification device(s), it shall become a permanent fixture of the occupancy and owned by the homeowner. The system shall be monitored by an approved supervising station and be maintained in accordance with NFPA 72.
