NOTICE OF INTENT TO
ADOPT ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

TAKE NOTICE that the Department of Public Instruction will hold a public hearing to address proposed new rules to the North Dakota Administrative Code, Chapter 67-23-06, on February 28, 2012, in Grand Forks, from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. in Conference Rooms 5D and 5E of the Grand Forks County Office Building, 151 South 4th Street, Grand Forks, North Dakota; in Fargo, also on the 28th, from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. in the Fercho Conference Room, at the Fargo Public Library, 102 North 3rd Street, Fargo, North Dakota; on March 1, 2012, in Minot, from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. in Suite 18 of the North Central Human Services Center, 1015 South Broadway, Minot, North Dakota; and in Bismarck, also on the 1st, from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. in the Fort Totten Room of the State Capital, 600 East Boulevard Avenue, Bismarck, North Dakota.

The purpose of the proposed rules is to provide schools with a process for implementing responses to intervention procedures that is consistent with federal IDEA laws, assists student learning, and aids in the early identification of students with learning disabilities. The proposed rule is not expected to have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000.
