FINAL ACTION ON BILLS.

House file 79, a joint resolution request-ing Delegate Kidder to secure an appro-priation from the sales of public lands to e used in the payment of bounties for the destruction of grasshoppers, was taken and passed by a vote of twelve to one, Mr. Burleigh voting in the negative.

House file 41, to locate a territorial road from Swan Lake to Sloux Falls, was, on y motion of Mr. Mills indefinitely postponed.

House file 80, to give authority to the commissioners of Union county to aid in rebuilding the Big Sloux bridge and to construct a drain ditch was taken up and after an attempt to indefinitely, postpone it,

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Council convened at one o'clock.

Present all the members.

House file 43, authorizing school district No. 1, of Grand Forks county, to issue bonds, was taken up and passed, Messrs. Gunderson and Miner voting in the neg-

On Motion of Mr. Pettigrew, the enacting clause was stricken from house file 73, a bill to establish the boundaries of the third judicial district upon the division of the territory.

House file 83, providing for the payment of a certain portion of the road tax in Yankton was passed by unanimous vote.

House file 4, the political code, was taken from the table, variously amended and passed by unanimous vote.

Council bill 31 was taken up and the house amendments thereto were concurred

The council then took a recess to seven o'clock p. m.

EVENING SESSION

All the members present.

House file 76 was, on motion of Mr. Pettigrew, indefinitely postponed.

House file 60 was, on motion of Mr. Burleigh, postponed until the first day of the next session

House files 40 and 85 were indefinitely postponed.

A message was received from the gov ernor giving notice of his approval of bills 46, 58, 59 and 60.

Notice having been received that the house refused to concur in the council amendments to house file 4, Messrs. Burleigh, Balley and Miner were appointed as conference committee on the subject.

The conference committee performed its work and reported that a satisfactory arrangement had been agreed upon by the two houses.

On motion Messrs. Bailey, Wallace and Miner were appointed a committee to wait upon Governor Pennington and Inform him that ten o'clock had been agreed upon as the bour when the legislature would adjourn.

House file 52, for an act declaring cerwas taken up and passed, Mr. Miner voting In the negative.

On motion the hour of adjournment postponed to 10 25 o'clock

A message was received from the gover nor giving notice that he had approved council bills 31 and 44.

The hour fixed for adjournment having nearly arrived Mr. Miner moved that the thanks of the council be tendered to the president, clerks and officers of the council for their fatthful discharge of duties, and the motion was adoptPresident Valentine said :

Gentlemen of the Council :- I am unwilling to permit this last epportunity to pass, without expressing my most sincere thanks as I now do, for your assistance in the performance of my duties, and for the uniform courtesy shows me as your presiding offi cer, during these last, and 'most laborious and important hours of this session; not illing to strike the blow which will seperate us forever, without first expressing the hope that if, in the heat of debate, any ill feeling may at any time have been engend-ered, such feeling may be forgotten as we pass the threshold of this hall.

Be assured my friends, that my kindest wishes will follow each of you to you homes, and that the memory of my associates and associations here will ever be a source of delight to me.
