DAKOTA'S LEGISLATURE.

The Press and Dakotaian's Report of the Proceedings of the Council and House of Representatives.

Fourteenth Session-Eleventh Day.

Council.

No session of the council to-day. Will meet at 7 o'clock this evening.

House.

House convened at the usual hour. Prayer by the chaplain.

Roll call showed all members in their scats and the speaker in the chair.

Minutes of yesterday's proceedings read and approved.

The speaker appointed Frederick Pound and Fred. Brancroft as pages for the house.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES.

By Mr. Moore—Reporting back from committee on corporation house bill No. 11, favoring its passage.

MOTIONS.

Mr. Kennedy moved the withdrawal of house bill No. 18 for correction. Motion adopted.

NOTICE OF BILLS.

By Mr. Kennedy—Repealing section 501 of the civil code.

By Mr Landman—Amending chapter 14, section 40 of the present school law. By Mr. Dickey—Amending section 101 of chapter 1 of the justice code.

By Mr. Baynes—Enabling the commissioner of Hutchinson county to fund their outstanding indebtedness, and legalizing warrants heretofore issued by

the county of Armstrong.

By Mr. La Moure—Establishing the county of Walsh and defining the boundary thereof.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS.

By Mr. Boyles—House file No. 25, amending an act entitled an act providing a board of education for the city of Yankton.

By Mr. Hale—House file No. 26, regarding the herding and driving of stock. By Mr. Rohr—House file No. 28, repealing sec. 4, chapter 9 of session laws of 1872-3.

FIRST READING OF COUNCIL BILLS.

Council bill No. 8—Amending an act to amend chapter 13 of the political code.

Council bill No. 12-Amending sec. 7, of the justice code.

SECOND READING OF COUNCIL BILLS

Council bill No. 12—Locating a territorial penitentiary. Referred to committee on penal institutions.

Council bill No. 4—Amending sec. 2 of chapter 28 of the political code, entitled revenue. Referred to committee on judiciary. The speaker here called Mr. La-Moure to the chair.

Council bill No. 6—Providing for an additional compensation for the judge of the first judicial district. Referred to select committee of the members of the first judicial business.

Mr. Speaker here resumed the chair.

Several bills not being printed and several others being incorrectly printed, a motion was carried to defer further action on such bills until correctly printed copies could be obtained.

Mr. Wells offered a resolution that the speaker of the house be authorized to refer all bills on their second reading, to such committee as he may deem proper, subject at any time to correction of such reference by the action of the house. The resolution was adopted.

On motion of Mr. La Moure, house file No. 19 was read a second time and referred to the committee on counties and townships.

SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILLS.

House file No. 21—For the protection of game. Referred to committee on territorial affairs.

House file No. 23—Amending sections 324 and 325 of the code of civil procedure.

ADJOURNMENT.

House adjourned till to-morrow 10 o'clock.
