House Bill 1339

Exempting motor passenger buses city owned or franchised from registration fees and provide a refund of motor fuel tax for said vehicles.

- (1) The Highway Commissioner is in favor of this legislation because it will encourage those transit companies operating with municipal limits to stay in business, and maybe stimulate others to begin such an enterprise.
- (2) Through the operation of urban transit facilities the number of passenger vehicles being used on city streets will be reduced in turn reducing the traffic congestion problem.
- (3) By reducing the traffic congestion problem the need for urban construction such as street widening will be lessened and will save the State Highway Department more money than will be lost by the exemption of registration fees and the refund of fuel tax for these vehicles.
