recommends that the same be amended as follows:

On page 1, line 1, delete everything after the words "A BILL", delete the remainder of the bill and insert in lieu thereof the following: "for an Act to amend and reenact section 57-60-14 and 57-60-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the allocation of revenue formulas for the privilege tax on coal conversion facilities.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE

STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.) Section 57-60-14 of the 1975 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read

57-60-14. ALLOCATION OF REVENUE.) The state treasurer, on or before July fifteenth of each year, shall allocate all moneys received from all coal conversion facilities in each county pursuant to the provisions of this chapter and moneys received for those taxes for which a credit is allowed pursuant to section 57-60-06, notwithstanding the provisions of section 57-33.1-08, (((in the following manner:

1. The first one hundred thousand dollars of annual revenue received from the taxation of each coal conversion facility in each county pursuant to this chapter shall be allocated one hundred))) thirty-five percent to the

2. The second one hundred thousand dollars of annual revenue received from the taxation of each coal conversion facility in each county pursuant to this chapter shall be allocated fifty percent to the county))) and

(((fifty))) sixty-five percent to the state general fund.

(((3. All annual revenue in excess of two hundred thousand dollars but not in excess of five hundred thousand dollars received from the taxation of each coal conversion facility in each county pursuant to this chapter shall be allocated twenty-five percent to the county and seventy-five percent to the state general fund.

4. All annual revenue in excess of five hundred thousand dollars but not in excess of one million dollars received from the taxation of each coal conversion facility in each county pursuant to this chapter shall be allocated fifteen percent to the county and eighty-five percent to the state

general fund.

5. All annual revenue in excess of one million dollars received from the taxation of each coal conversion facility in each county pursuant to this chapter shall be allocated ten percent to the county and ninety percent to the state general fund.)))

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.) Section 57-60-15 of the 1975 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read

as follows: 57-60-15. DUTY OF COUNTY TREASURER - ALLOCATION TO POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS.) Moneys received by counties under the

provisions of section 57-60-14 shall be apportioned as follows: 1. (((Fifteen))) Thirty-five percent of all revenues allocated to any county shall be paid by the county treasurer to the incorporated cities of the county based upon the population of each incorporated city according to the last official (((decennial)))/ regular or special federal census (((;))) or the census taken in accordance with the provisions of chapter MONDAY, MARCH 14, 1977

40-02 in case of a city incorporated subsequent to such census.

2. (((Forty))) Thirty-five percent of the revenues allocated to any county shall be deposited by the county treasurer in the county general fund to be used for general governmental purposes (((; and))).

3. (((Forty-five))) Thirty percent of all revenues allocated to any county shall be apportioned by the county treasurer to school districts within the county on the average daily (((attendance distribution))) membership basis, as certified to him by the county superintendent of schools."
