Under House Bill No. 1277, at least one new form of gambling would be permitted. In order for the Attorney General's office to carry out its responsibilities of enforcing the charitable gambling act at a minimum level, it is felt that \$1,008,129 in additional appropriations will be necessary. At present there are only two full time gambling enforcement positions in the Attorney General's office. Funding for the next biennium as suggested above will create enforcement positions which will enable this office to more completely carry out its responsibilities under the gambling law. The Attorney General believes that the best enforcement tool is the knowledge that if this law is abused, the voters or the legislature can outlaw gambling entirely.
