This bill would limit cost to a school district to two times the state average cost of education when it is necessary to send a student out of the special education unit of residence but within the state for special education instruction. It would require that state special education funds pay any amount over two times the cost paid by the district for instruction. Transportation would be paid under the rules and regulations of the Department of Public Instruction. About 115 students are now attending school districts outside their own multidistrict units. For the next biennium 150 students per year are estimated.
