relating to the president pro tempore of the senate, legislative procedures, powers and duties of the lieutenant governor, and impeachment proceedings; to repeal section 13 of article XI of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota, previously designated as section 199 of the Constitution prior to publication of the renumbered Constitution, relating to impeachment proceedings; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the committee on Constitutional Revision.

Senators Albers, Iszler, Roen, Adams, Moore introduced:

**Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4029.** — A concurrent resolution urging Congress to direct and adequately fund the Department of Agriculture to establish a task force to eradicate leafy spurge on all federal lands and a cost-sharing program to eradicate leafy spurge on all nonfederal land.


