Narrative: There will be no fiscal impact on the State Department of Health. HB 1661 pertains to district health units organized according to provisions of chapter 23-14 NDCC. The other health departments in the state are organized under chapter 23-03 NDCC as county boards of health, therefore they would not be impacted by HB 1661. Because the proposed amendment is permissive, the potential financial impact has been computed at the minimal level using the following formula. Also, some district boards will probably choose not to be compensated for attending board meetings because of fiscal constraints. Total number of board members in all districts x \$45.00 x number of days; the number of days will vary from a minimum of 4 as required by subsection 23-14-09 NDCC to a maximum of 25 specified in HB 1661. Historically, district boards of health have been meeting one day quarterly. Two boards meet monthly, and only infrequently do other boards meet more often than the minimum required.
