HB 1119: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-39.1-24 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to additional retirement credit for teachers.

HB 1136: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-05.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to registration and fees of lobbyists.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.

HB 1148: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 16.1-11-01 and 16.1-11-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the primary election; and to repeal sections 16.1-11-02, 16.1-11-03, 16.1-11-04, 16.1-11-07, 16.1-11-23, and 16.1-11-34 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the presidential preference primary.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Committee on Judiciary.**

HB 1154: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 24-15-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to minimum requirements for temporary roadblocks.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Committee on Transportation.**

HB 1164: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 62-04-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the disposition of weapons taken or found on persons arrested.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Committee on Judiciary.**

HB 1192: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 40-40-05, 40-40-08, 40-40-09, and 40-40-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to budget requirements of municipalities; and to repeal section 40-40-19 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to municipal liabilities that occur before the final appropriation is approved.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Committee on Political Subdivisions.**

HB 1194: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 26-41-19 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the assigned claims plan.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Committee on Industry, Business, and Labor.**

HB 1195: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 26-41 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the Automobile Reparations Act, and to amend and reenact section 26-02-42 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to uninsured motorist coverage.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Committee on Industry, Business, and Labor.**

HB 1200: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 3 of section 57-51.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of property for extraction tax purposes.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Committee on Finance and Taxation.**

FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

HCR 3002: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to create a special Legislative Council interim committee to conduct a study of the impacts on North Dakota from the proposed Tenneco coal gasification plant at Wibaux, Montana.
