The fiscal impact will then be on the state agencies requesting services. It is estimated that 425 inspections were done at the request of other state agencies during the last calendar year. The impact of charging a fee for these inspections would approach the salary and benefits for one (1) additional inspector for the Fire Marshal's office.
