Narrative:

This measure would have no positive or negative fiscal impact on the Workmen's Compensation Fund or the State General Fund. Rate classifications would be established in the Workmen's Compensation System to spread the risk among cities or counties who elect workmen's compensation coverage under the provisions of this measure.

An actuarial analysis of the associated risks will have to be performed by the Bureau's actuarial consultant. We presently estimate the cost of coverage to be approximately 8 ¢ per hour for county inmates and 12 ¢ per hour for city inmates involved in covered work release programs. These rates are consistent with the Bureau's rates for coverage of persons employed in county and city government.

It should be noted that the premiums collected from cities and counties participating in this program would probably be far less than the cost of any lawsuit brought by an injured inmate employee against a city or county not electing coverage under the provisions of this Act.
