REP. STRINDEN ANNOUNCED that, because of the proposed amendment to the rules, the Twelfth order of business on the Legislative Organizational Agenda will be delayed until tomorrow, Wednesday, December 5, 1984.

REP. KRETSCHMAR explained the amendments to the Rules of the Forty-eighth Legislative Assembly.

MOTIONS

REP. KRETSCHMAR MOVED that the proposed amendments to House Rule 350 be adopted, which motion prevailed.

REP. STRINDEN MOVED that the House adopt as temporary rules the Rules of the Forty-eighth Legislative Assembly, with amendments, which motion prevailed. The rules were adopted as amended.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE RULE 350

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. House Rule 350 is hereby amended to read as follows:

350. DETERMINATION OF SENIORITY SEATING IN HOUSE CHAMBERS

1. Seniority shall be measured by the total number of years a member has served in the Legislative Assembly, regardless of continuity of terms of office, and shall include service in the Senate.
2. Seating of members shall be in the following order and other members of each district delegation of the same political party shall be seated immediately after each of the members indicated:
 - a. The Majority Leader.
 - b. The Minority Leader.
 - c. The Assistant Majority Leader.

- d. The Assistant Minority Leader.
 - e. Past Speakers in the order of seniority.
 - f. The Speaker.
 - g. The remaining members in the order of seniority.
3. Seat numbers 40 and 64 shall be reserved for the Majority Leader and Minority Leader.
 4. The Speaker may also permit extra seats on the floor of the House chambers to be utilized by members of the press, and may reserve certain seats for that purpose.
 5. When two or more members have exactly the same seniority as determined pursuant to subsection 1, seating among those members shall be in ascending numerical order based on the number of the district represented. When two or more members from the same district or multidistrict have equal seniority, ~~their names~~ the member or members of the party of the Speaker, if any, shall be seated first; thereafter members shall be listed in alphabetical order for seating purposes.

REP. KRETSCHMAR MOVED that a committee of nine be appointed to act as a Committee on House and Joint Rules, which motion prevailed.

THE SPEAKER APPOINTED as such committee, Reps. Riley, Kretschmar, Strinden, R. Hausauer, Conmy, L. Hanson, Mertens, Hoffner, and Kelly.

REP. KRETSCHMAR MOVED that a committee of three be appointed to act as a Committee on Photography, which motion prevailed.

THE SPEAKER APPOINTED as such committee, Reps. Winkelman, Eckroth, and A. Williams.

REP. KRETSCHMAR MOVED that a committee of three be appointed to act with a like committee from the Senate, as an Inaugural Planning Committee, which motion prevailed.

THE SPEAKER APPOINTED as such committee, Reps. C. Anderson, Rydell, and O'Connell.

The Committee from the Senate was received, which committee announced the Senate was now organized and ready to transact business.

The committee appointed to notify the Governor and the Senate that the House was organized and ready to perform its constitutional functions announced it had completed its work, and the committee was subsequently discharged.

MOTION
