Narrative: The estimated fiscal impact of amended Bill No. 1234 will be to reduce state general revenues by approximately \$6,000 during the 1987-89 biennium. The purpose of the bill is to reduce to a justifiable amount the potentially unconstitutional annual license fee of \$500 for a transient merchant's license, which could result in a federal civil rights lawsuit against the state and require payment of the attorney's fees and costs of a plaintiff who successfully contests the constitutionality of the present statutory fee. In the 1983-85 biennium, transient merchant licenses issued by the Attorney General's Licensing Division at the existing \$25 annual fee resulted in total revenues of \$1,550. During fiscal year 1985-86, after the fee had been raised twenty-fold to \$500 per year, transient merchant license revenues totalled \$7,000. Total 1985-87 biennium revenus of \$14,000 are anticipated.							
The Attorney General's proposed budget for the 1987-89 biennium estimates total transient merchant license fee income of \$15,000 based upon the present \$500 license fee. If Bill No. 1234, as amended by the House, is enacted lowering the fee to \$200 per year, it is anticipated that the number of licenses issued would increase to forty-five for the biennium for total revenues of \$9,000 for the 1987-89 biennium.
