It is unlikely that a two-year medical school is a practical option. Therefore, no accurate cost estimate can be made at this time. However, an estimate of discontinuing the four-year medical school was made by Ernst & Whinney in its November, 1986 study. The estimated biennial cost reduction of discontinuing the school and contracting for 210 medical students is about \$9 million from the General Fund and \$8.5 million in special funds. See the attached analysis prepared by Ernst & Whinney in its recently completed study. If one assumes that discontinuing the third and fourth years is equal to one-half of discontinuing all four years, the biennial cost reductions would be about \$4.5 million from the General Fund and \$4.25 million in special funds.
