LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR RUTH MEIERS

Remarks by President Pro Tem Redlin

This week, triumphs will be bittersweet and overshadowed by the passing on Thursday, March 19, 1987, of Lieutenant Governor Ruth Meiers. Ruth passed away at 6:00 p.m. Central Standard Time at Medcenter One Hospital in Bismarck, North Dakota, at the young age of 62.

With her goes a part of all who knew her. Our sympathy goes to her family and loved ones who today feel the void and loss of a truly great wife, mother, grandmother, and friend. In the final analysis, our supreme judgment will be made on how we treated our fellow man. In that respect Ruth has no equal. Her dedication to North Dakota and its people will serve as an example of selflessness and kindness for decades to come.

Ruth brought to the Governor's Office a human, warm touch. She brought to the North Dakota State Senate a gentle respect for the laws. The Lieutenant Governor brought to the people of North Dakota and to politics a warm smile that moved without resistance through party lines, from dignitaries to the smallest child. Ruth personified, before anything else, North Dakota. Her pioneer spirit, her courage, and her faith was a reminder to all of us of the heritage we have inherited. Her face, that enduring courageous smile is ingrained into the minds and hearts of us

all. We are grateful for having known her. The strength that she passed to all of us in her last days will be her legacy. She will so dearly be missed. Sleep is hers now, but her memory will comfort those close to her heart. Her presence will be felt in North Dakota character, not only today, but for all generations to come.

"SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 39-29-03 of the 1985 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

1. Any all-terrain vehicle dealer as defined in section 39-29-01 shall make application for registration for each all-terrain vehicle sold on the premises of said dealer. Application for registration must be made to the motor vehicle department in the form the department prescribes and furnishes. The registration must state the name and address of every owner of the all-terrain vehicle and be signed by at least one owner. A copy of the application must be carried on the person when operating and is evidence of registration for the first thirty days after the date of application.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 39-29-04 of the 1985 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

1. Registration and payment of fees is not required of:

- a. All-terrain vehicles owned and used by the United States or another state or its political subdivisions.
- b. All-terrain vehicles registered in a foreign country and temporarily used in this state.
- c. All-terrain vehicles validly licensed in another state and which have not been within this state for more than thirty consecutive days.
- d. ~~All-terrain vehicles used exclusively for work on private agricultural lands or on industrial jobsites on private land.~~
- e. All-terrain vehicles used exclusively in organized track racing events."

On page 2 of the engrossed bill, after line 2, insert the following section:

"SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 39-29-10 of the 1985 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

39-29-10. Operation by persons under age sixteen. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person at least twelve years of age and under sixteen years of age who is not in possession of a valid operator's license or permit to operate an all-terrain vehicle may not, except upon the lands of the person's parent or guardian, operate an all-terrain vehicle. A person at least twelve years of age may operate an all-terrain vehicle if unless the person has completed an all-terrain vehicle safety training course prescribed by the director of the state parks and recreation department and has received the appropriate all-terrain vehicle safety certificate issued by the ~~commissioner~~ state. The failure of an operator to exhibit an all-terrain vehicle safety certificate on demand to any official authorized to enforce this chapter is presumptive evidence that that person does not hold such a certificate. Fees collected from each person receiving certification must be deposited into the all-terrain vehicle trail tax fund for all-terrain vehicle safety education and training programs."

Any legislative appropriation for the leafy spurge control program of sections 63-01.1-06.1 through 63-01.1-06.3 shall be expended ~~only~~ for reimbursement of the cost of leafy spurge control according to this section to private landowners, including lessees, tenants, renters, or operators of private land, county weed boards, or cities, and for other leafy spurge programs as the cost-share review board determines to be necessary."
