This proposed legislation affecting section 54 of the North Dakota Century Code

This proposed legislation affecting section 54 of the North Dakota Century Code implements statutory amendments to the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 (the Uniform Act) made by the Uniform Relocation Act Amendments of 1987, Title IV of the Surface Transportation and Uniform Relocation Assistance Act of 1987, (1987 Amendments) Pub. L. 100-17, 101 Stat. 246-256. The Uniform Act applies to all Federal or federally assisted activities that involve the acquisition of real property or the displacement of persons, including displacements caused by rehabilitation and demolition activities.

The fiscal impact of this bill is dependent upon the number of relocations undertaken during a year. It is estimated that each eligible business relocation may increase in cost by up to \$10,000 and that each residential relocation payment could increase up to \$7,500.

Based upon the past four years of experience, it is estimated that Highway Department annual costs for relocation may increase as follows:

Average 1.5 business moves @ \$10,000 = \$15,000 1 residential @ \$7,500 =  $\frac{7,500}{$22,500}$
