Narrative: By moving the implementation date of the unemployed parent provision of the Family Support Act of 1988 from October 1, 1990 to July 1, 1889, an additional 15 months of grant payments to families will be incurred. Additional increased costs would result from other congressionally imposed benefits.			
If passed into law, this bill would add another \$6,055,047 to the fiscal impact of the Family Support Act of 1988 during the 1989-1991 Biennium. Of this amount, \$4,055,105 would be federal funds, \$1,570,954 would be state funds, and \$428,988 would be county revenues.			
This estimate is based on the estimated participation of 500 AFDC unemployed parent (AFDC-UP) households.			
With an anticipated average monthly grant payment of \$445 and the 15 month earlier start-up date, the 500 AFDC-UP households would generate about \$3,300,000 in additional AFDC grant expenditures. The balance stems from estimated added costs of day care, extended benefit periods for day care services and medical assistance, and the participation of more recipients in the training and employment components of the job opportunity and basic skills training program.
