Impact on State Government Telecommunication System Costs:

Data collected for this estimate was obtained from Central Data Processing and the Office of Management and Budget. Central Data Processing compiled the costs of affected services for a representative month's telephone billings. This data includes state government usage billed to Central Data Processing which coordinates the state's central telecommunications system. Some usage is billed directly to state agencies; however, those billings would be extremely difficult to compile and they would not be material to the information as a whole. The Office of Management and Budget provided the Consumer Price Index projections and the fund source breakdowns.

Telephone billings are separated into two categories -- long distance and local service -- as noted below: (1 month)

It is estimated that approximately 70% of long distance charges are attributable to access which is affected by this bill. Therefore, \$87,353 of the long distance bill is subject to the Consumer Price Index factors.

As a result, the fiscal year 1990 estimated annual charges are:

Since the bill does not clearly specify the timing of price changes, certain assumptions will be made. It is assumed that price changes will be effective January 1, 1990 and January 1, 1991. Assuming this, fiscal impacts would occur as follows:

Impact on Public Service Commission Operating Costs:

It is highly probable that Commission hearings would be required to clarify interpretations of this bill. It is uncertain, however, if Commission hearing costs would be chargeable to the Public Service Commission or to the telecommunications company involved in the hearing.

If costs are chargeable to the Public Service Commission, the expected cost to the general fund follows:
