It appears, from my reading of SB 2478, that the farm credit counseling program would be required to assign a counselor to assist debtors in preparing financial and other information prior to an initial mediation meeting (page 3, lines 26 through page 4, line 2).

It appears that we would also need to assign a counselor to appear at the initial mediation meeting with the debtor, and possibly at subsequent meetings if they were held.

It is not clear to me whether the full cost of mediation would be defined to include costs associated with providing credit counselors (page 6, lines 18-19), but I am assuming they would not.

The projected costs to FCC could be estimated as follows:

Preparatory meeting ... 8 hrs (incl travel time) @ \$11.50 = \$92.00100 miles travel @ .20/mile = 20.00

\$112.00

Mediation meeting ... 6 hrs (incl travel time) @ \$11.50 = 69.00100 miles travel @ .20/mile = 20.00

\$ 89.00

Followup mediation meetings ...

\$ 45.00

Total per case ..... \$246.00

In a highly speculative estimate of the fiscal impact of HB 1444, I estimated that perhaps 500 cases may go to formal mediation. Since SB 2478 appears to require mediation in more cases than would HB 1444, one could assume that 600-800 cases may be involved.

The fiscal impact could then be estimated at \$172,200 per year (700 cases @ \$246/case), 50% of which should be eligible to be matched by federal grant dollars.

If this bill is passed, it seems likely that the CRB/Farm Credit Counseling program would need to be re-certified for federal matching funds. The outcome of such re-certification process is impossible to predict.
