Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Industry, Business and Labor.

HB 1256: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 43-04-31 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to qualifications required to be a registered barber.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Industry, Business and Labor.
