## REQUEST

SEN. NALEWAJA REQUESTED that Sen. Todd's remarks be printed in the Journal, which request was granted.

SEN. TODD: Mr. President and members of the Senate: I too rise in support of the proposed amendments and in support of the bill with the amendments attached. SB 2466 is the only piece of legislation in the legislative session which deals with the human skeletal remains and associated artifacts in the collection of the North Dakota State Historical Society.

As you know, the State Historical Board has voted to return all the skeletal remains and associated prehistoric artifacts to the intertribal reinterment committee without the benefit of any study or analysis. Many of the artifacts that have been sealed in boxes in the storage area of the Heritage Center represent some of the most spectacular examples of middle and late woodland period prehistoric art forms available in the world today. This collection of material represents the state's only link with the people who hunted and farmed this land over the last 10,000 or more years.

Some of these precious works of art had been scheduled to become part of the new phase of the exhibits in the Heritage Center. Spaces have been built for them, identification text prepared and the exhibits planned around them. The board's decision to return all of these materials to the reinterment committee will leave an extreme void in our knowledge and will severely inhibit our ability to interpret the period of North Dakota's past which is significantly prior to any recorded history.

What this is akin to, is basically taking a significant portion of a chapter of North Dakota's history which is yet to be written, tearing it from the book, and burning it before it can even be recorded. We and countless future generations of North Dakotans will be the losers.

Can you imagine what the impact would be if the Egyptian government suddenly decided to reinter all of the spectacular works of art that were entombed with the great pharaohs such as Tutankhamen, Ramses II, and Amenhotep. There would be an international outcry. What may happen here is no different.

Prior to releasing the remains for reinterment, attempts should be made to determine lineage and ensure that, in fact, all the remains are native American. We should also attempt to learn as much about these people as we can through scientific nondestructive analysis prior to reinterment. It was in fact, under my tenure as president of the State Historical Board that the first reinterment policy was drafted, placed in front of public hearings, and adopted. At that time, it was always intended that analysis would be performed prior to reinterment.

Unfortunately, the hasty decision of the Historical Board for blanket reinterment without analysis has already resulted in at least one documented case of the remains of an Irishman having been turned over to the reinterment committee for burial. William Riley Lufsey, a 23 year old buffalo hunter from Kansas was involved in a dispute with the Marquis DeMores in 1883 over fences that the Marquis built in the Medora area. Lufsey and two companions confronted the Marquis and his men and a gunfight ensued. Lufsey was killed and was buried by the citizens of Medora 150-200 yards due north of the Chateau so that the Marquis would overlook his grave as he stood on his front porch. In 1940, a W.P.A. crew was building a road to the Chateau and unearthed the skeletal remains of a young man wrapped in blue cloth buried in a simple casket. Because the grave was unmarked, the remains wound up in the collection of the Historical Society. Nondestructive physical analysis of the remains which were turned over to the reinterment committee would have indicated that Lufsey's remains had Caucasian characteristics and hence they would have been retained for potential return to the next of kin or would have been appropriately reinterred. It was only after the reinterment had taken place that independent research identified who the remains were and this research is conclusive. The professional staff at the Heritage Center believe strongly that there are other Caucasian remains in the collection. Only nondestructive physical analysis will tell for sure.

I believe strongly that a definition of what constitutes study as it pertains to existing items in the collection, as well as future items that may be unearthed, belongs in North Dakota statute so there cannot be radical swings in Historical Board policy without the board's having to come to the legislature and ask for these changes. The legislative process allows for a much more indepth hearing and significantly more indepth analysis than hearings for administrative rules. I have chaired both.

Private moneys to fund nondestructive analysis can be raised from various grants, foundations, and even local charitable gaming organizations as well as the federal government. All of these sources have been used before when Dr. Douglas Owsly of the Smithsonian Institute learned that the board was going to reinter the remains in the Historical Society collection, he offered to assist with the analysis but this offer was rejected by the board.

SB 2466 in its unamended form is patterned after legislation introduced into Congress by Congressman Byron Dorgan, and it is reflective of the emerging national policy on analysis prior to reinterment. The proposed amendments to the bill represent a significant move towards a compromise position and it is a radical departure from what it appears federal policy is going to be in the future.

With all of this in mind, I would ask that you carefully weigh your decision on SB 2466 and that you cast your vote based upon your perception as to what is best for the State of North Dakota and the many generations of North Dakotans to follow us. When the collection is purged from the Heritage Center, it is gone forever and our ability to reconstruct a portion of North Dakota's past goes with it.

It is perhaps an ultimate irony to throw away so much of our prehistory in North Dakota's Centennial year. I hope you will give this bill a "green" light.

#### REQUEST

SEN. HEIGAARD REQUESTED that Sen. Maixner's remarks be printed in the Journal, which request was granted.

SEN. MAIXNER: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Senate. Let me say first of all that the issue here is not one of cost. I do not care if it is free to examine the remains that we have in the Heritage Center. The issue here is one of human decency of one people to another. The issue is whether the scientific curiosity of a few people in the radical fringes of the professional community should take precedence over the human decency that we ought to be displaying to the Indian people, particularly in this our Centennial year.

Let me deal with a couple of things that have been brought up in the arguments. First of all, that this is the only bill that deals with the remains that are currently in the Heritage Center. Yes, it is the only bill, but the board has the responsibility and the authority within the existing law to deal with those remains, and they have done what they believe is the right thing, and that is to return those remains to the Indian people to be reinterred.

Let us talk a little bit about the artifacts. What are we talking about in artifacts? If someone a hundred or two hundred years from now went out and dug up my grandfather and decided that his belt buckle was an artifact of this period, would we think that that was the proper thing to do? Well that is what we are looking at here. These are items that were buried with people, and according to the Historical Society Board, State Historical Board, the artifacts of the deceased that came up out of the ground are stored in those boxes, and those are the only items that are going to be returned under the board's policy. We are not going to be taking things out of display cases. We are not going to be ripping apart the Heritage Center in order to return artifacts. We are going to take the boxes as they are and return them to the people for reinterment. That is what we are talking about here: the priceless artifacts, if there are any, are in the boxes with the remains and they ought to be returned to the ground with the remains.

The one documented case, supposedly documented, I have gone through the files as well. It is amazing how long that information has laid in those files and nobody brought it up until the last few days. But the fact is, it is not well documented that it was a white person that was returned. The matter of fact, out of 150 sets of remains that have been examined so far, not one has been ascertained to be a white person. The predominant view is that the remains that are there are in fact native Americans, and they ought to be returned. And if there happens to be one white person among them, I would guess that maybe the proper place for that white person would be in the ground as well, instead of lying in a box on a shelf in the Heritage Center.

I would hope that the Senate goes along with the committee recommendation, defeats this piece of legislation, allows the State Historical Board to go on with their work, and do what they need to do.
