Fifty-second Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, January 9, 1991

The House convened at 12:45 p.m., with Speaker R. Anderson presiding.

The roll was called and all members were present except Representatives Bateman, Brokaw, Huether, and Ring.

A quorum was declared by the Speaker.

FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

Reps. Bateman, Henegar and Sens. Solberg, Evanson introduced:

HB 1250: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 20.1-12-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to permits for private shooting preserves.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

Reps. Payne, Thompson and Sen. Traynor introduced.

HB 1251: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-03-01.5 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to legislative apportionment requirements.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Rep. Ritter introduced:

HB 1252: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 35-03-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to collateral real estate mortgages.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Rep. Cleary introduced:

HB 1253: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 53-06.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the issuance of conditional licenses to conduct games of chance.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Rep. Carlisle introduced:

HB 1254: A BILL for an Act to repeal section 6-03-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to additional optional loans and advances by banks.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Industry, Business and Labor.

Reps. Oban, Byerly, Clayburgh and Sens. DeKrey, Jerome, Kelly introduced:

HB 1255: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 51-15-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to remedies for violation of consumer protection provisions.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Reps. Meyer, DeWitz, Kerzman and Sen. Krauter introduced:

HB 1256: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 16.1-01-10 and 44-08-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to petitions for the recall of political subdivision elected officials.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Political Subdivisions.

Reps. A. Olson, Myrdal, D. Olsen and Sen. Vosper introduced:

HB 1257: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-10.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the rights of residents of certain health care facilities.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Human Services and Veterans Affairs.

Reps. Oban, A. Olson, Hanson and Sens. Heinrich, Nelson, Meyer introduced:

HB 1258: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 20.1-02-23, 20.1-02-24, and 20.1-02-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to appointments to the game and fish advisory board; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

Reps. Myrdal, Aarsvold and Sen. O. Hanson introduced:

HB 1259: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-65-02 and subsection 8 of section 15-65-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the membership and powers and duties of the educational telecommunications council.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Education.

Reps. Tollefson, Kretschmar, Flaagan and Sens. Langley, Krebsbach, Meyer introduced:

HB 1260: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 53-06.2-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to expenses for horse racing licensees.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.

Reps. Clayburgh, Larson, Gates and Sen. Stenehjem introduced:

HB 1261: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsections 2 and 4 of section 6-08-16 and subsections 2, 3, and 7 of section 6-08-16.2 of the

North Dakota Century Code, relating to fees for collection costs on checks or drafts issued without sufficient funds.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Reps. Scherber, Svedjan, Payne and Sens. Graba, Stenehjelm introduced:

HB 1262: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 32-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to providing immunity to a physician who renders medical care on a voluntary basis at free clinics.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Reps. Skar, Nicholas, Gorder and Sens. O'Connell, Tallackson, Vosper introduced:

HB 1263: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 19-10-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to notice requirements for alcohol-blended gasoline.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Reps. Oban, Tollefson, Scherber and Sens. Heigaard, Evanson introduced:

HCR 3011: A concurrent resolution expressing support for the United States' troops in the Persian Gulf, condemning the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait, and urging the President, in consultation with the Congress, to articulate clearly the policies and objectives underlying the involvement of the United States in the Persian Gulf and to exhaust every avenue in attempting to achieve a peaceful solution to the Persian Gulf crisis.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.

JOINT SESSION

The Joint Session of the House and Senate convened at 12:45 p.m., with Speaker R. Anderson presiding.

SPEAKER R. ANDERSON PRESENTED Lieutenant Governor Omdahl to the Assembly and turned the gavel over to him.

The Honorable George A. Sinner, Governor, and Mrs. Sinner, North Dakota Supreme Court Justices and Elected Officials were escorted into special reserved seats in the Assembly by members of the North Dakota National Guard. The Joint Session was convened by Lieutenant Governor Omdahl. Welcoming remarks were given by Willis Heinrich, President of the State Historical Board. The documentary "Skyscraper Capitol: A Break with Tradition" was shown.

John A. Holabird, Jr., the son of the 1932 North Dakota State Capitol Architect also addressed the Assembly.

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OMDAHL DECLARED the Joint Session dissolved.

The House stood adjourned pursuant to Representative Kloubec's motion.
