SB 2308: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 53-06.1-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the distribution of gaming items.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Political Subdivisions.

SB 2313: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 26.1-25-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to premium reductions for motor vehicle accident prevention course completion.

SB 2355: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 3 of section 14-05-22 and subdivision j of subsection 1 of section 14-09-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the consideration of evidence of domestic violence by courts in determining rights to custody and visitation of children.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Human Services and Veterans Affairs.
