COMMUNICATION FROM SECRETARY OF STATE JIM KUSLER

December 4, 1990

North Dakota Century Code section 54-03-03 instructs the Secretary of the Senate and Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives to "...make a correct roll of the members of their houses respectively to whom certificates of election have been issued by the proper officers." The Office of Secretary of State has issued Certificates of Election to the names appearing on the attached list with the Great Seal affixed.

On November 21, 1990, and again on December 3, 1990, the State Canvassing Board met in the Office of Secretary of State and canvassed the certified abstracts of returns from North Dakota's fifty-three counties. The attached certified list is a true and correct list of the candidates who received the highest number of votes for the legislative offices voted upon at the November General Election. As directed by Chapter 16.1-15, Certificates of Election have been issued to these duly elected officers.

Copies of the Certificates of Election for each officer-elect will be provided for your records. Finally, each officer-elect has been forwarded the Oath of Office which must be subscribed and filed in the Office of Secretary of State.

SEN. HEIGAARD MOVED that a committee of two be appointed to escort Associate Justice Gerald W. Vandewalle of the Supreme Court of the State of North Dakota to the rostrum for the purpose of administering the Oath of Office to the newly elected Senators, which motion prevailed.

THE PRESIDENT APPOINTED as such committee, Sens. E. Hanson and Nalewaja. Associate Justice Vandewalle was escorted to the rostrum and administered the Oath of Office to the newly elected Senators.

Mr. Jay E. Buringrud, Assistant Director of the Legislative Council, explained the legislators' packets and the other materials that were distributed to the desks of the Senate members.

THE SENATE RECONVENED pursuant to recess taken, with President Omdahl presiding.

SEN. NELSON MOVED that the Secretary of the Senate, Desk Reporter, and the Sergeant-at-Arms remain in office until the end of the organizational session, which motion prevailed.

SEN. NELSON MOVED that the Senate and Joint Legislative Rules of the Fifty-first Legislative Assembly, as adopted on Thursday, December 8, 1988, be adopted as the temporary rules of the Senate with the following amendments, which motion prevailed.

The Committee on Employment be changed from five members to six members.

The Committee on Senate and Joint Rules be changed from nine members to ten members.

The Inaugural Planning Committee from three members to four members.

The Committee on Correction and Revision of the Journal from three members to four members.

The Committee on Arrangements for Senate Committee Rooms from three members to two members.

SEN. NELSON MOVED that a committee of two be appointed to act as a Committee on Arrangements for Senate Committee Rooms, which motion prevailed. The President appointed as such committee, Sens. Yockim and Vosper.
