## Fiscal Note / Narrative (Continued)

The budget process and the Agency's biennium budget, SB 2017, cover the expenditures anticipated for the upcoming biennium. As the HFA is a revenue entity (enterprise fund), the revenues are indicated as being equal to the expenditures, when in actuality revenues are expected to surpass expenditures; thus resulting in net earned revenues to the Agency. For the 1993-95 biennium, \$890,580 is the net revenue amount projected from the HUD Section 8 Certificate and Voucher program operations.

These and other net revenues of the Agency are used to fund other Agency programs. The Helping H.A.N.D. program, based on 1992 funding, is expected to distribute \$600,000 to county and tribal governments during the 1993-95 biennium.

To the extent that LHA's exercise their pre-emptive option, the net revenues generated by the HFA would be reduced; thereby diminishing the funds available for other programs, such as Helping H.A.N.D. and the \$1,500,000 transfer to the General Fund proposed in Governor Schafer's revised budget.
