ACTUARIAL IMPACT (1) - Submitted in accordance with NDCC Section 54-03-25.

The ND Workers Compensation Bureau, together with it's actuary, has reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill and has determined that passage of the bill will have an actuarial impact to the fund.

Passage of this bill will allow Social Security Retirement offsets effective July 1, 1993. A one—time loss reserve reduction of \$6,000,000 would occur on June 30, 1993.

Passage of this bill would reinstate some of the offset lost as a result of failure of HB 1137. The impact described above will only exist in the event that HB 1137 fails.
