STATE EMPLOYEE RELATIONS BOARD

1. Salaries for 3 Board members.

\$14,250

Assumes the Board meets for one week each in the first two months in a biennium, and then for three days a month for the remaining twenty-two months in that biennium. Rate of reimbursement \$62.50 a day.

Operating Expenses

Operating expenses are estimated and calculated at 1/3 of the annual salaries line, less fringes, times 2 for the two years of the biennium.

STATE EMPLOYEE RELATIONS BOARD

- 1. Salaries for the three Board members. This assumes that the Board will spend two weeks in the first two months in active session performing the following functions:
 - a. Adopting rules.
 - b. Advertising, recruiting and interviewing for the Executive Director, Administrative Assistant, Attorneys, Mediators and Arbitrators.

Following the initial period, the Board may be able to meet for three days a month to resolve appeals regarding the bargaining units, and to hear any matters referred to the Board as unfair labor practices.

2. Operating Expenses. Costs of operating the Board assume that office space is not available in the Capitol. Costs of the Board include:

Employee travel

Printing (notices of elections, ballots, rule drafts, etc.)
Data Processing (programming, recurring reports, rosters, lists
of those in bargaining units)

Postage

Advertising and Legal Notices (employment ads)

Office Supplies

Rent

OFFICE OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

1. Salaries. A skilled and experienced Executive Director who will conduct the day-to-day operations of this office is a specialist. Individuals who would function at this level would possibly have an advanced degree, and would be likely to have 10 years experience.

An Administrative Assistant would be required for record keeping, preparing correspondence and contract proposals, typing negotiation minutes and minutes of meetings for the Board, etc.

It would be necessary to retain an attorney to assist the agencies in negotiation preparation and actual negotiations. The Executive Director would also assist agencies in preparation for and in actual negotiations.

Fiscal Note: SB2502

Because it is assumed there will be from 12 to 20 successfully formed bargaining units, negotiations will need to be conducted with more than one unit at a time. It is essential that two negotiators be employed for the biennium so that negotiations can be concluded on a timely basis.

2. Operating Expenses. It is assumed there will not be space in the Capitol to house this activity.

Operating expenses will generate costs in the biennium largely due to the need to travel to various parts of the state frequently and conduct negotiations. Additionally, merely determining the bargaining units and hearing an appeal will generate costs. Costs will be incurred for:

- 3. Equipment. Equipment needed will include desks, phones, chairs, file cabinets, word processing equipment and the like.
- 4. Items not included as costs.
 - a. Wages paid to employees to attend meetings.
 - b. Materials used for employee meetings prior to elections.
 - c. Costs for an appeal to District Court from a decision by the Board.
 - d. Added costs to the State for negotiations if an arbitrator's order is rejected by the Legislature (Bill Section 14, item 13).

ESTIMATE FOR THE 95-97 BIENNIUM

The estimate for the 95-97 biennium is the same as the previous biennium, less the cost of equipment.
