**FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS**

Reps. Hanson, Kroeber and Sens. Goetz, Marks introduced:

**HB 1223:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 36-01-00.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of domestic animal for purposes of the state board of animal health. Was read the first time and referred to the Agriculture Committee.

Reps. Bernstein, Soukup, Gorman and Sens. Nalewaja, Solberg introduced:

**HB 1224:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 65-02-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to arbitration on workers' compensation claims.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

Reps. Byerly, DeWitz, Torgerson and Sens. Krebsbach, Solberg introduced:  
HB 1225: A BILL for an Act relating to care of an elderly adult; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Reps. Byerly, Bateman, Wald and Sen. Solberg introduced:  
HB 1226: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 16.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to restrictions on campaign contributions; to amend and reenact section 16.1-10-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to corrupt practices; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Reps. Wald, Byerly, Kroeber and Sens. W. Stenehjem, Malewaja introduced:  
HB 1227: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 40-57.3-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to transfers of funds between the city visitors' promotion fund and the city visitors' promotion capital construction fund.

Was read the first time and referred to the Political Subdivisions Committee.

Reps. Soukup, A. Olson, Howard introduced:  
HB 1228: A BILL for an Act to create and enact nine new sections to chapter 43-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to barber continuing education requirements; and to amend and reenact sections 43-04-01 and 43-04-39 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the registration of barbers by the board of barber examiners.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Reps. Soukup, Tollefson, Mahoney introduced:  
HB 1229: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 23-06-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the deposit of payments made on pre-need funeral contracts.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Reps. Payne, Wald and Sens. Lindgren, Tallackson introduced:  
HB 1230: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 26.1-26-31.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to continuing education requirements for insurance agents.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

The House stood adjourned pursuant to Representative Freier's motion.
