STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

DEPARTMENT 512 - EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE - The salaries and wages line item is increased by \$10,444, \$2,089 of which is from the general fund to reflect the state employee salary increase provisions of House Bill No. 1018.

The information services line item is reduced by \$802, \$33 of which is from the general fund in accordance with provisions of House Bill No. 1018.

The operating expenses line item is increased by \$1,938 of special funds for Merit System payments to Central Personnel.

In total, this amendment increases funding for Emergency Management by \$11,580, \$2,056 of which is from the general fund and \$9,524 of special funds.

Engrossed HB 1006 was placed on the Seventh order of business on the calendar.

It is the intent of the legislative assembly that if the total of amounts appropriated and the amounts transferred from the state aid distribution fund, before budget allotments, is less than the amount deposited in the state aid distribution fund during the 1993-95 biennium, the legislative assembly shall provide a deficiency appropriation to local political subdivisions of the excess amount deposited and that the deficiency appropriation be for the 1993-95 biennium. This section recognizes that transfers may be made by the state treasurer, upon the request of the director of the office of management and budget, from the state aid distribution fund to the general fund, as authorized by 1993 House Bill No. 1005.

SECTION 3. BUDGET REDUCTIONS - TRANSFER. The appropriation provided in section 1 of this Act is to be reduced by the director of the budget by the same percentage as any general fund reductions or

allotments made pursuant to North Dakota Century Code sections 54-44.1-12 and 54-44.1-13.1 which may occur during the biennium beginning July 1, 1993, and ending June 30, 1995, and an amount equal to the reduction must be transferred by the state treasurer from the state aid distribution fund to the general fund."

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

DEPARTMENT 085 - PAYMENTS TO POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE - This amendment removes the provisions of the bill which would have eliminated the state aid distribution fund and changes the funding source from the general fund to the state aid distribution fund.

This amendment eliminates the \$500,000 appropriation from the state aid distribution fund for the senior citizens mill levy match, leaving a \$51,500,000 appropriation from the state aid distribution fund for payments to political subdivisions.

This amendment adds a section of legislative intent stating that if the amount deposited in the fund is more than the amount appropriated and transferred from the fund it is the intent that a deficiency appropriation be made by the 1995 Legislative Assembly for the 1993-95 biennium. The intent section recognizes that transfers may be made by the State Treasurer, as authorized by 1993 House Bill No. 1005.

This amendment adds a section which requires the appropriation to be reduced by the same percentage as any general fund appropriation under North Dakota Century Code Sections 54-44.1-12 and 54-44.1-13.1 and transfers an amount equal to the reduction to the general fund.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

DEPARTMENT 150 - LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE - The amendments reduce operating expenses by \$29,824 from the general fund in accordance with the provisions of House Bill No. 1018.

DEPARTMENT 160 - LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE - The salaries and wages line item is decreased by \$57,127 from the general fund to reflect the \$60 per month salary increase plan in accordance with the provisions of House Bill No. 1018.

The operating expenses line item is decreased by \$9,894 from the general fund in accordance with the provisions of House Bill No. 1018. The operating expenses line item is reduced by \$10,000 from the general fund to reduce funding for committee travel.

In total, the amendments reduce the bill's general fund appropriation by \$106,845.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

DEPARTMENT 270 - VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE - The salaries and wages line item is decreased by \$46,663, of which \$23,331 is from the general fund and \$23,332 from other funds, to reflect the \$60 per month salary increase plan in accordance with the provisions of House Bill No. 1018.

The information services line item is reduced by \$1,428, \$1,207 of which is from the general fund and \$221 from other funds, in accordance with the provisions of House Bill No. 1018.

The grants line item is increased by \$255,000 from the general fund for secondary education grants to ensure meeting the maintenance of effort requirement.

The adult farm management line item is decreased by \$250,000, from \$500,000 to \$250,000, from the general fund, and Section 2 regarding the intent of the use of the \$250,000 is deleted. Section 2 stated it is the intent of the Legislative Assembly that \$250,000 of the \$500,000 be used in a cooperative program between vocational education, Farm Credit Review Board, and other appropriate agencies. The Senate had added \$250,000 and the intent section. The remaining \$250,000 provides the amount recommended by both governors.

In total, the amendments reduce the general fund appropriation by \$19,538, other funds by \$23,553, and all funds by \$43,091.

Engrossed SB 2022 was placed on the Seventh order of business on the calendar.

2. Employers or their duly authorized representatives may review and have access to any files of their own injured workers.
3. Physicians or health care providers treating or examining workers claiming benefits under this title, or physicians giving medical advice to the bureau regarding any claim may, at the discretion of the bureau, inspect the claim files and records of injured workers.

4. Other persons may have access to and make inspections of the files, if such persons are rendering assistance to the bureau at any stage of the proceedings on any matter pertaining to the administration of this title.

The claimant's name; social security number; date of birth; injury date; employer name; type of injury; whether the claim is accepted, denied, or pending; and whether the claim is in active or inactive pay status will be available to the public. This information may not be released in aggregate form, except to those persons contracting with the bureau for exchange of information pertaining to the administration of this title or except upon written authorization by the claimant for a specified purpose.
6. At the request of a claimant, the bureau may close the medical portion of a hearing to the public.
