SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION: The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, have reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

Based on the changes proposed in this bill, no change in the current loss reserves for prospective rate levels will occur. Coverage for this program will begin on the effective date of this bill. Roughrider Industries will reimburse the Workers Compensation Fund in full for the cost of claims incurred (including administrative costs) under this program. Workers Compensation does not have historical loss information for this class of coverage and, as a result, makes no estimate of the fiscal impact to Roughrider Industries.
