Fiscal Note Supplement HB 1028

The fiscal impact of this bill is dependent upon several factors: (1) the number of inmates employed in the private sector prison industry enhancement certification program (PIE); (2) the manufacturing process which will be utilized in the program (woodworking, metalwork, or new startup program); (3) the number and severity of injuries of the inmate participants. Because approval for participation in the PIE program is contingent upon providing Workers' Compensation coverage, the time-frame for the beginning of production is the 1995-97 biennium.

The estimates of expenditures for coverage are based on the assumption of a PIE-certified program in the RRI Furniture Shop employing 15 inmates during the 1995-97 biennium and increasing to 25 inmates in the 1997-99 biennium. Considering the payment of the prevailing wage which is a requirement of the program and the rate of \$11.10 for Classification 2803, Carpentry Shop Furniture & Woodworking Mfg. & Refinishing, the total expenditures are estimated to be \$30,000 and \$50,000, respectively. This includes the Workers' Compensation premium and the premium for supplemental insurance to cover claims in excess of premiums paid to Workers' Compensation.
