FISCAL NOTE NARRATIVE

Engrossed HB 1055 as amended is revenue neutral.

The original intent of HB 1055 was to assure that all funds of state departments, institutions, or agencies be on deposit at the Bank of North Dakota and that deposits to the accounts be completed in a timely manner.

Engrossed HB 1055 as amended allows state entities located outside of Bismarck to maintain accounts in local financial institutions for the clearing or cashing of checks and also assures that the funds are transferred to the Bank of North Dakota or State Treasurer in a timely manner so the maximum benefit and earnings can accrue to the State of North Dakota.

Engrossed HB 1055 as amended maintains Bank of North Dakota's state account deposit base, which is a major component in achieving BND's overall mission of encouraging and promoting agriculture, commerce, and industry within North Dakota.
