This bill requires a \$20 million dollar increase to the foundation aid line item for per pupil and transportation payments, including dollars for "small, necessary schools". The bill also implements a "guaranteed tax base" equalization program, for which the Department of Public Instruction requested \$40 million. The final section of the bill relates to the distribution of the tuition apportionment fund. While this does not have a fiscal impact on the state, it does impact the budgets of individual school districts.
