SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION: The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, have reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

The Bureau's Actuary, in his review of this bill, has concluded that there will be no actuarial impact as a result of the changes proposed.

Currently, the Bureau expends approximately \$30,000 a year on its publications. It is anticipated that the revenue derived by the authority provided in this bill would partially offset the cost of producing these publications.
