**SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION:** The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, have reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

The proposed change will serve to reduce loss costs for the Workers Compensation Fund in specific circumstances. However, these changes are not projected to have a material impact on the required rate and loss reserve levels of the Fund. The actuarial review includes both the bill as introduced and the amendments proposed in Draft 50627.0101 relating to unusual stress.
