Examination

BILL NO. HB 1414

SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION: The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, have reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

The changes proposed in this bill make no specific change in eligibility for benefits or in the level of benefits provided to injured workers. It may, however, impact the Bureau's ability to objectively adjudicate claims in certain situations. Although the financial or actuarial impact to the Fund cannot be measured or projected, the changes may produce a significant cost to the Fund if the Bureau's ability to obtain an independent evaluation is limited.
