## ND WORKERS COMPENSATION BUREAU 1995 LEGISLATION SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION

**BILL DESCRIPTION:** Public Corporation

BILL NO. Engrossed HB 1428; Draft No. 58384.0200

**SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION:** The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, have reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

Based on the Actuary's review, it is assumed that the changes proposed in this bill are limited to the organizational structure of the administrative policies and procedures of the agency. As a result, no actuarial impact is expected.

A review of the changes proposed in the bill by the Workers Compensation Bureau does not reveal any major changes to the operating costs of the agency. While changes of this magnitude in the organizational structure and its operations may have an impact on the operating costs, no estimate or projection of that impact is made here. Further review of the impact of the bill and the cost to the agency may be required in this area.
