## ND WORKERS COMPENSATION BUREAU 1995 LEGISLATION SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION

**BILL DESCRIPTION:** Exclusive Remedy

**BILL NO.** HB 1466

**SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION:** The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, have reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

Based on the Actuary's review of the changes proposed in this bill, there is no immediate impact expected on the rate levels charged by the Workers Compensation Fund. It is anticipated that work-related injuries will continue to be reported and paid by the Workers Compensation Fund. Beyond that, the changes proposed allow additional recovery by an injured worker through civil proceedings. The impact to policyholders as a result of this exposure will likely prove to be substantial. While the actuary made no projection about what the level of this impact might be, it is anticipated that the cost associated with this remedy, whether paid directly or in the form of a liability insurance premium, would create a significant increase in the cost of doing business in North Dakota.
