SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION: The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, have reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

Based on a review by the Workers Compensation Bureau and its Actuary, it is anticipated that the changes proposed in this bill will increase the annual cost of the Fund by more than \$1 million and, as a result, a rate adjustment of approximately 1% would be required to fund this change. In addition, it is expected that the Bureau's current liability for unpaid losses would increase by more than \$3 million under the proposed legislation.
