BILL DESCRIPTION: Repeal of the Social Security Retirement Offset

BILL NO. HB 1498

SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION: The Workers Compensation Bureau, together with its Actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuarial Consultants, have reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

Based on a review by the Workers Compensation Bureau and its Actuary, it is anticipated that the repeal of the current Social Security Retirement Offset would increase Workers Compensation rates by approximately 1% to 2%. In addition, liability for current claims would increase by at least \$17 million under the proposed legislation.
